

Mr. King:


I do miss the class interaction but I look on the whole school as being in my care. So although I may not be their particular class teacher I have a lot to do concerning their general welfare.

Mirjana:


What advice do you have for the Year 6 students?





On our way to the Senate we saw a lot of pictures of the former Prime Ministers and people who belonged or still belong to the Parliament.



It was very interesting watching and identifying some famous people in real life.



We went up to look at the House of Representatives. Miss Williams talked to us about the House of Representatives and Mrs Johnson did too.


We went into the lift and we looked at the big, big, Australian flag. We played on the green grass but Miss Williams said, "No play on the grass."

Silent choir an inspiration to all

A choir that makes no sound may seem like a contradiction in terms, but the Sydney Signing Choir showed a group of primary school children yesterday that there is nore than one way to sing.

The 24 white-gloved hands of the choir weaved and flurried in fluid sequence on the stage at Weetangera Primary School, keeping every hild and adult in the hall rapt.

The first song, I am Australian, had the hearing children singing dong with the chorus on the backing tape as the performers' perfectly choreographed gestures told the story of the song just as clearly and novingly as the most beautiful oices.

The sign language the choir uses, Auslan, is particularly expressive nd allows them to clearly display ne emotion of their material, according to one of the choir's teachers, Wendy Williams.

"It's a different language from

that used in schools, which is very stilted and strictured," she said. "Auslan uses one sign for a whole range of meanings and the facial expressions can change the meaning of a sign so it is far more expressive."

Choosing the songs and then working with the choir to choreograph the signs is a time-consuming and difficult job but one the teachers enjoy because the end result gives the kids so much satisfaction.

"They really enjoy it and it's fantastic because they get to sing songs even though they can't hear them," Mş Williams said.

The signing choir has been a part of the Liverpool Primary School for 15 years and has members aged from eight to 13. Many of its former members are still performing.

The second choice for the primary school concert, A Whole New World, from the film Aladdin, was even more popular with its audience as the performers dropped to their

knees and took the audience on "a magic carpet ride".

The Weetangera school was chosen for the performance because it has six hearing impaired students integrated into its classes and most of the students and teachers know some sign language.

School principal Margaret Clough was thrilled with her visitors.

"It's great to have them here because it shows all the kids what can be done," she said. "The choir is also a fine role model for our hearing impaired kids."

In a fitting finale to the performance the entire school joined in a round of soundless applause, waving their hands in the air — the sign for clapping.

The children on stage returned their thanks with an even simpler sign; two thumbs up from each of them.

My parents were very happy when I arrived home.





Point Score:

The adjudicator awards each speaker with points in the following way:

Matter: (40 points).

- 1. Quality of argument.
- 2. Clarity.
- 3. Logic
- 4. Good illustration.

Method: (20 points).

- Construction of speech team work.
- Usage of time.
- Rebuttal.

Manner: (40 points).

- 1. Eye Contact.
- 2. Deportment and gesture.
- 3. Language (good conventional English).
- 4. Voice (articulation, word flow.
- 5. Warmth, sincerity, overall personality.

Team Composition.

Each team has four members, but only 3 actually speak during the debate. The fourth team member helps by taking notes and thinking of a rebuttal.

A debate is made up of two teams, the Government and the Opposition. The Government agrees with the topic and tries to convince the audience and the adjudicator that the statement is true.

The Opposition, disagrees with the topic and likewise tries to convince the adjudicator and the audience that the statement is false. This is done through a constructed way with each speaker having a different role to play, but working together as a team.

Each speaker would display what they have researched and show that they have worked with other team members to construct an understandable and convincing argument in the time allocation of 3 minutes.



We were very nervous but the team had great fun.



WHAT WE LEARNT

BONES

There are over 200 bones in your body. Each bone connected to another bone. Your skull protects your brain from getting damaged. Your skull is connected to your neck which is connected to your spine and the tail bone. The spine and tail bone is at the back of your body.

The humerus is the upper arm between your shoulder and elbow. The ulna and radius is located between the humerus and the wrist. Your lower hand is called carples and your fingers are called metacarples. The carples are connected to the wrist and the metacarples are connected to your carples.

Your ribs are connected to your breast bone. You have twelve bones in your ribs.

Your pelvis is just under your hip.

The teachers enjoyed the Book Fairs as much as the students. There have been many positive comments about it. They too hope we have more book fairs in the future.


Everyone has put in a wonderful effort in helping with the book fair. With the profit we made we are able to buy a whole new collection of new books for our Library.

This may have been our first book fair but hopefully not the last.


